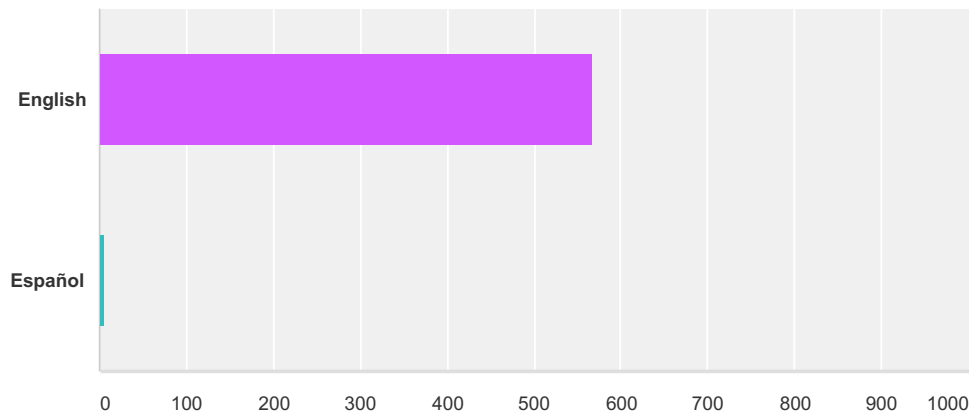

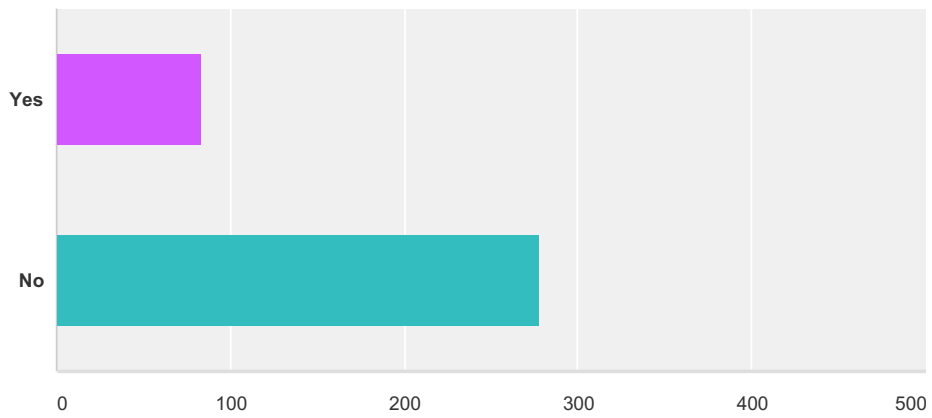

Q2 I have a child/children who attend the New York City public schools now.

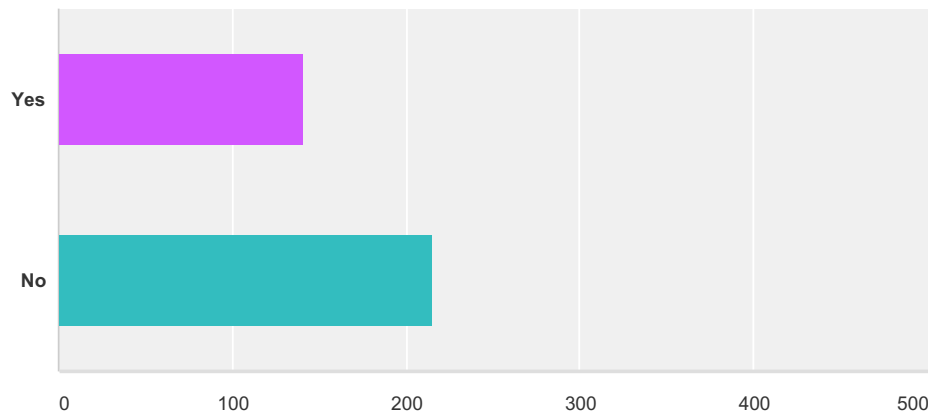

Q3 My child/children attended the NYC public schools in the past.

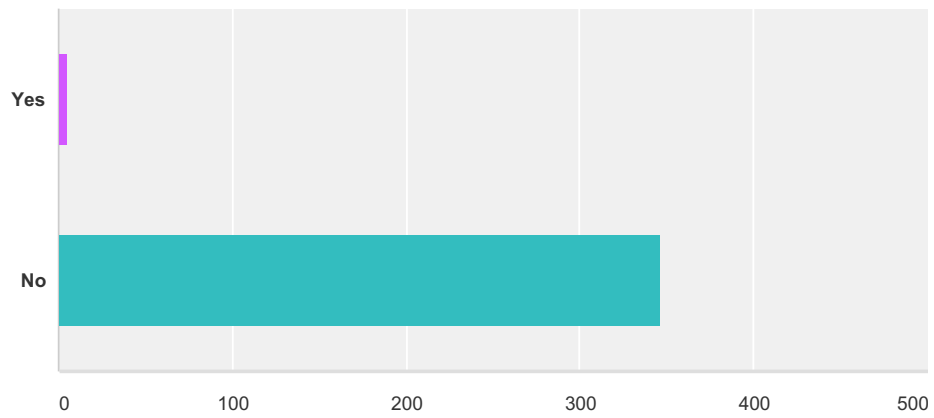

Q4 I am a student in the NYC public schools now.

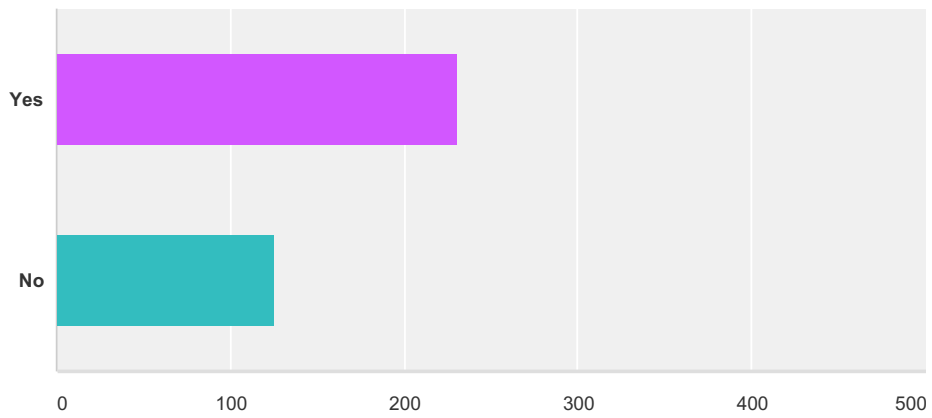

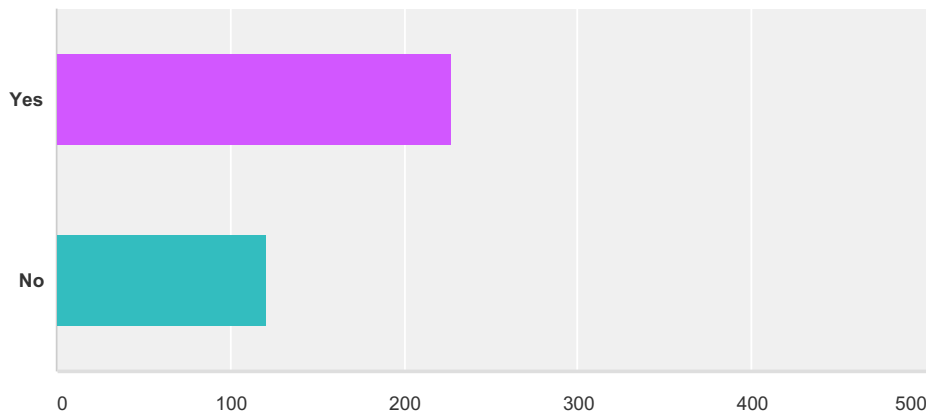

Q6 I received a high-quality arts education during my K – 12 education.

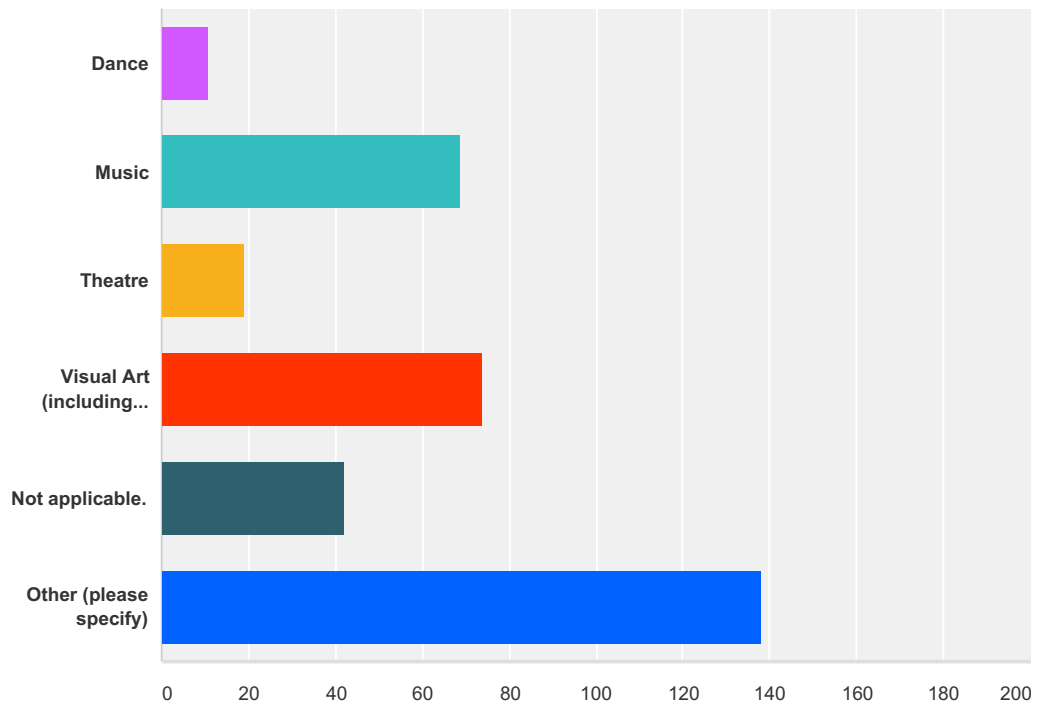

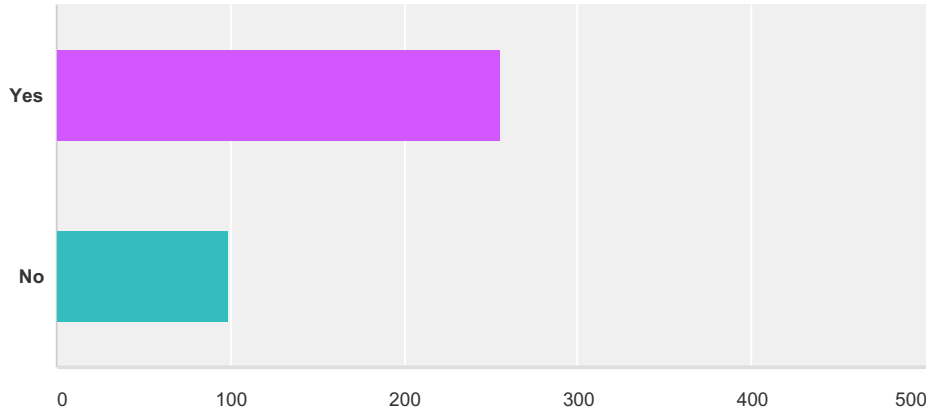

Q12 Did you know there are New York State arts education learning requirements for all NYC Pre-K – 12th grade students?

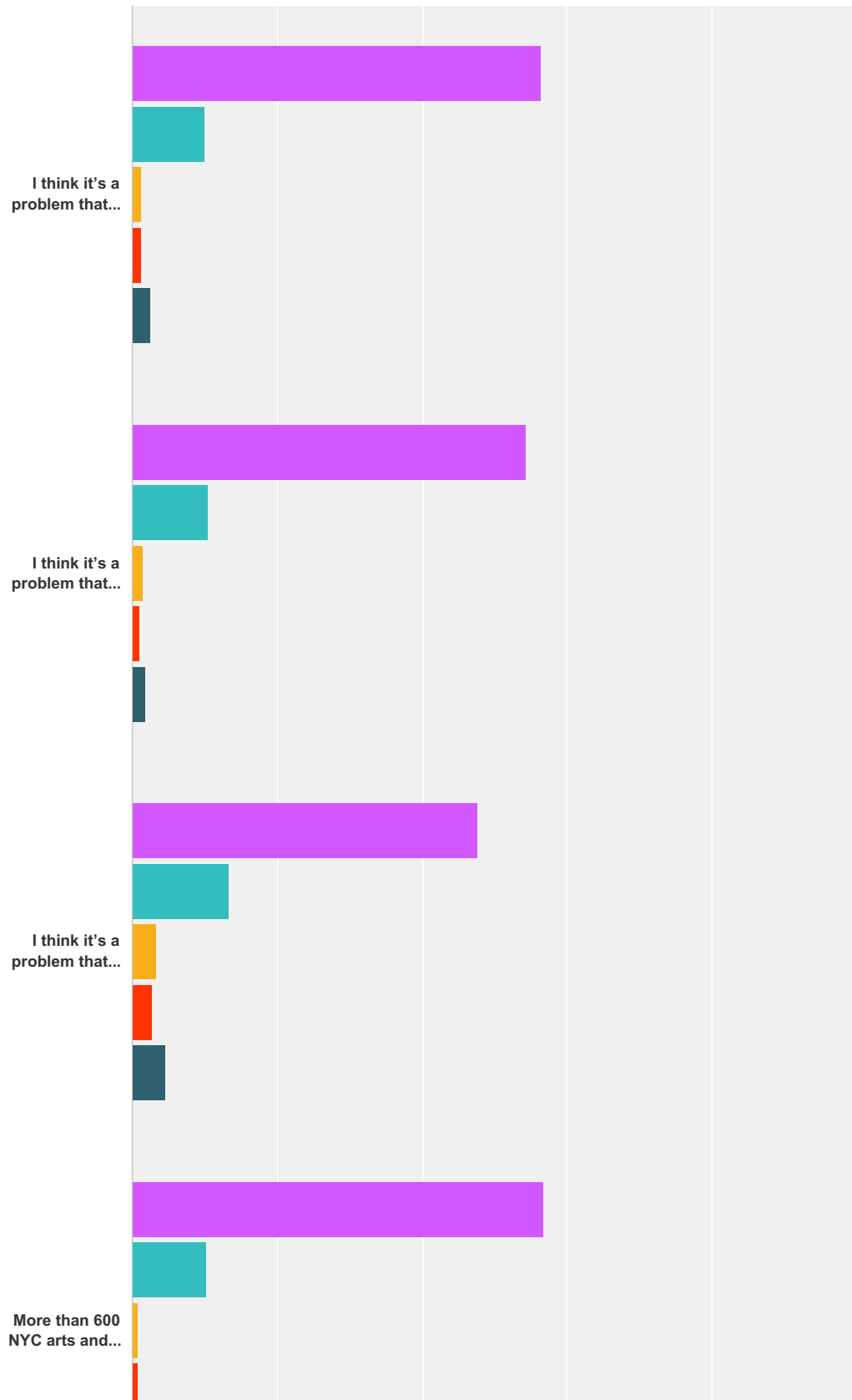

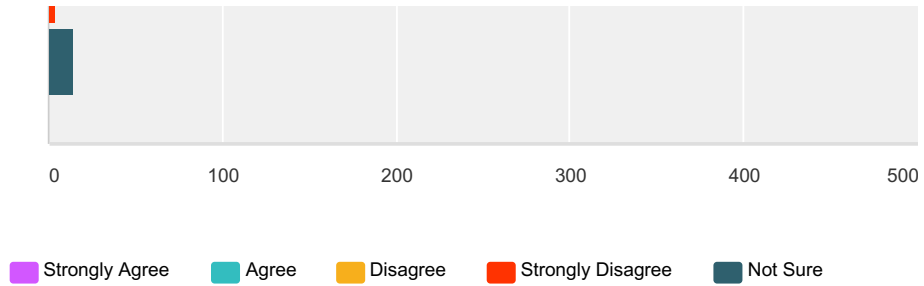

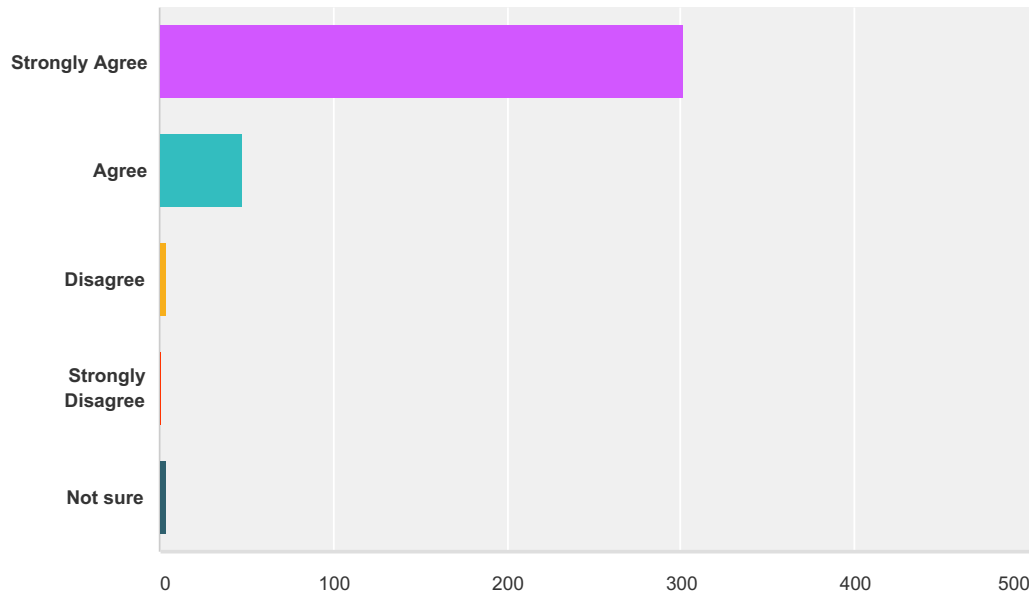

Q16 Every year sufficient funds should be budgeted so that all public school students receive the arts education required by law.

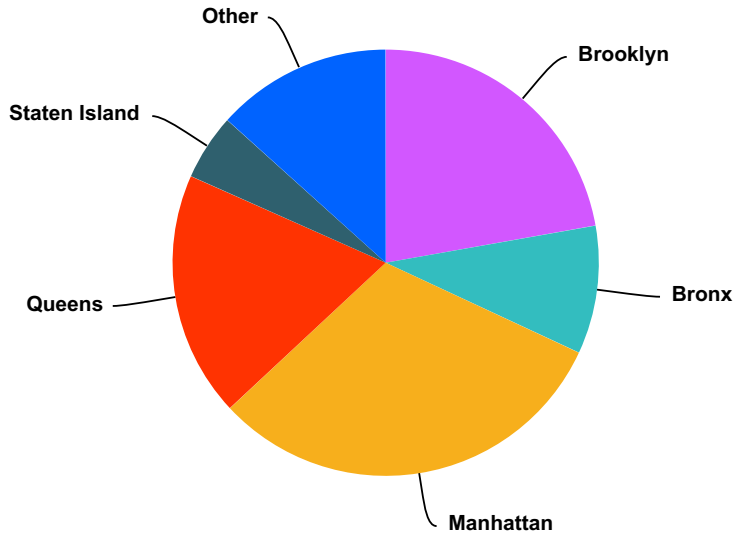

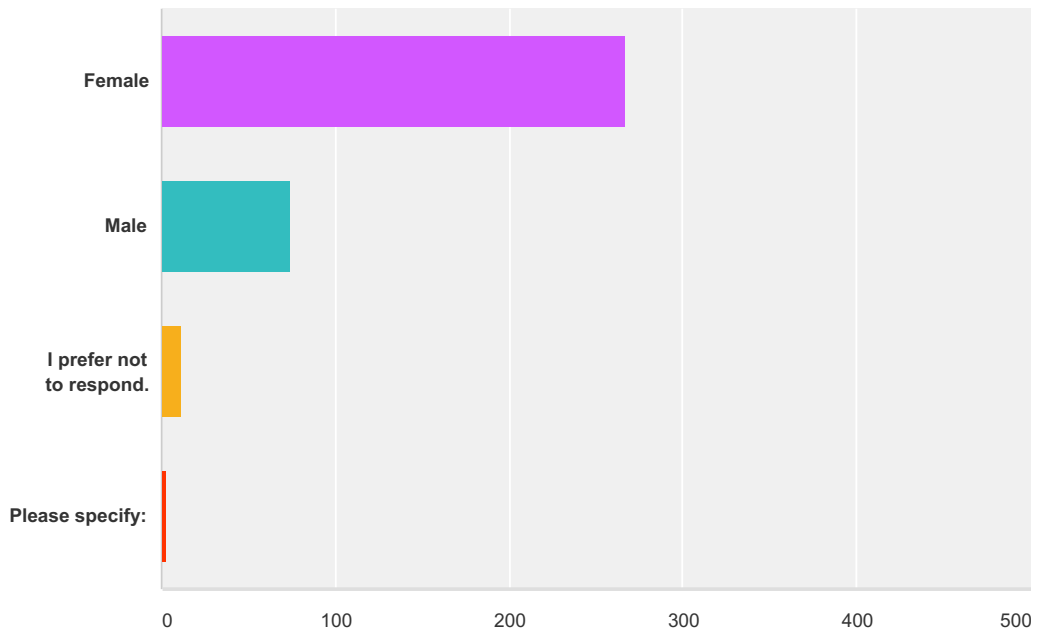

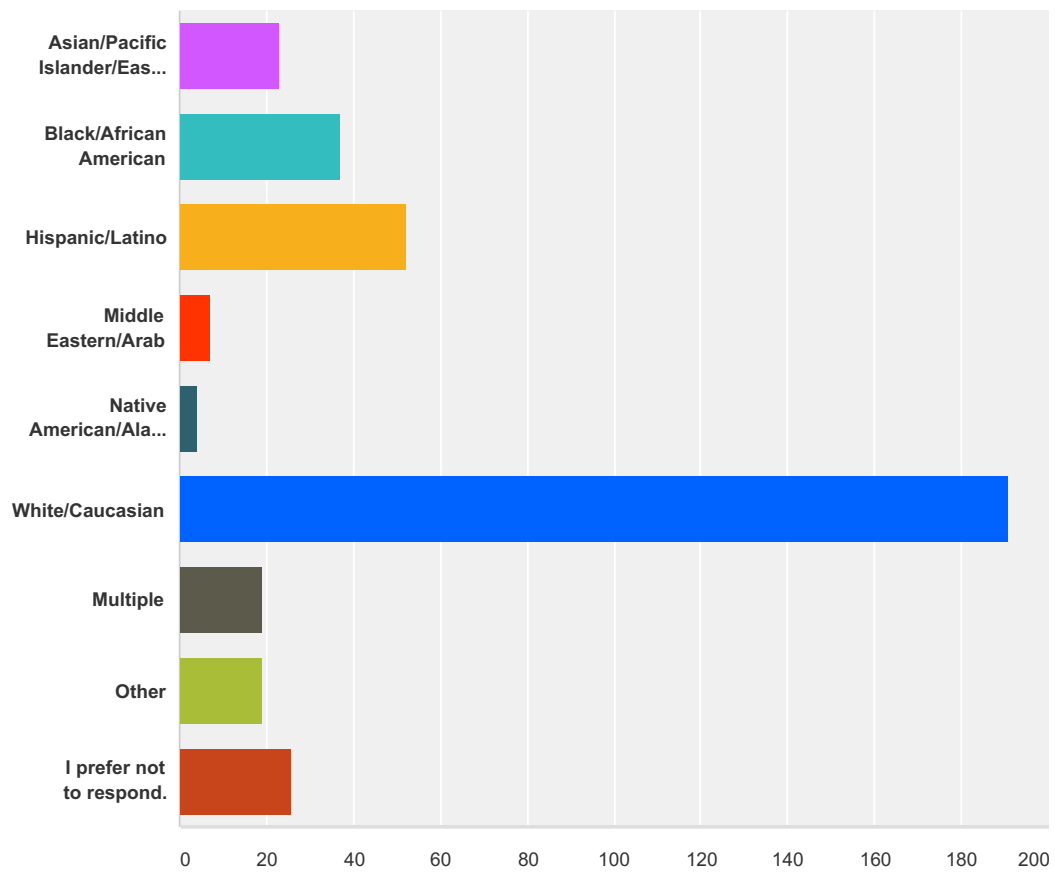

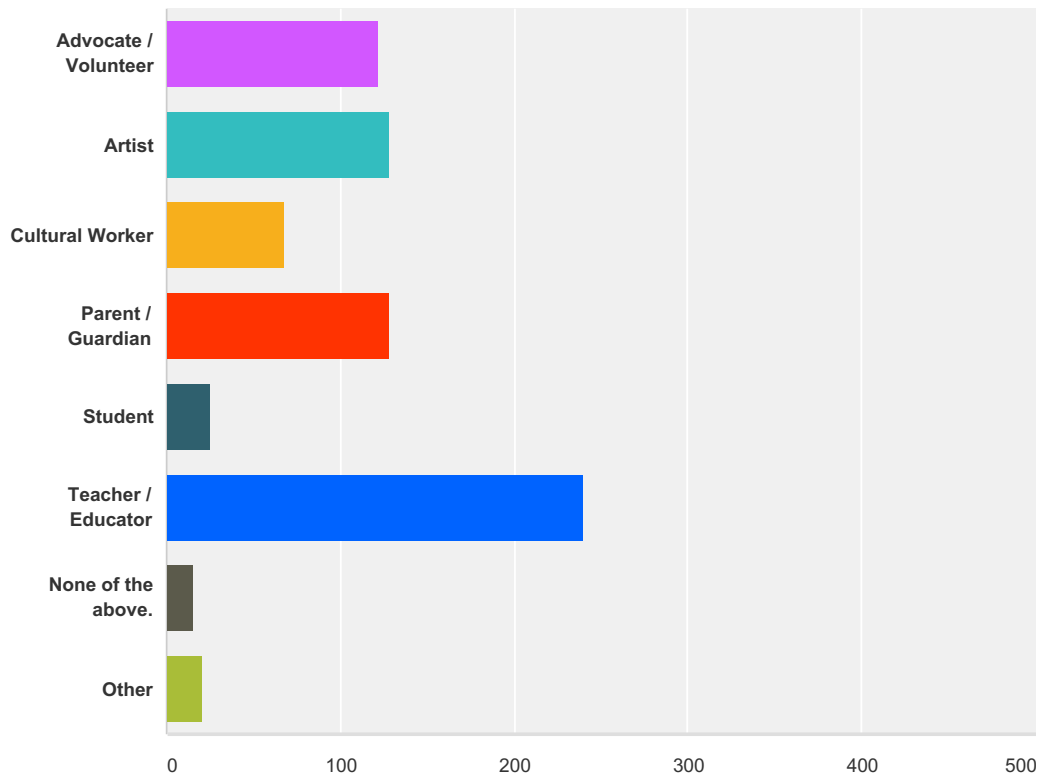

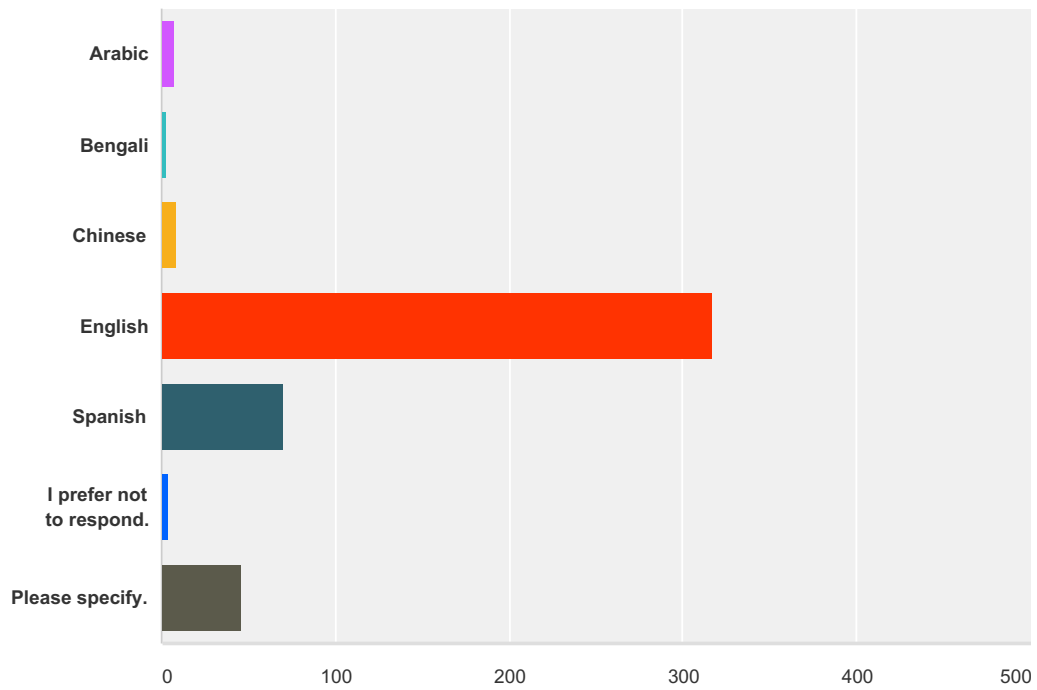

Q24 What is your household's total approximate income?

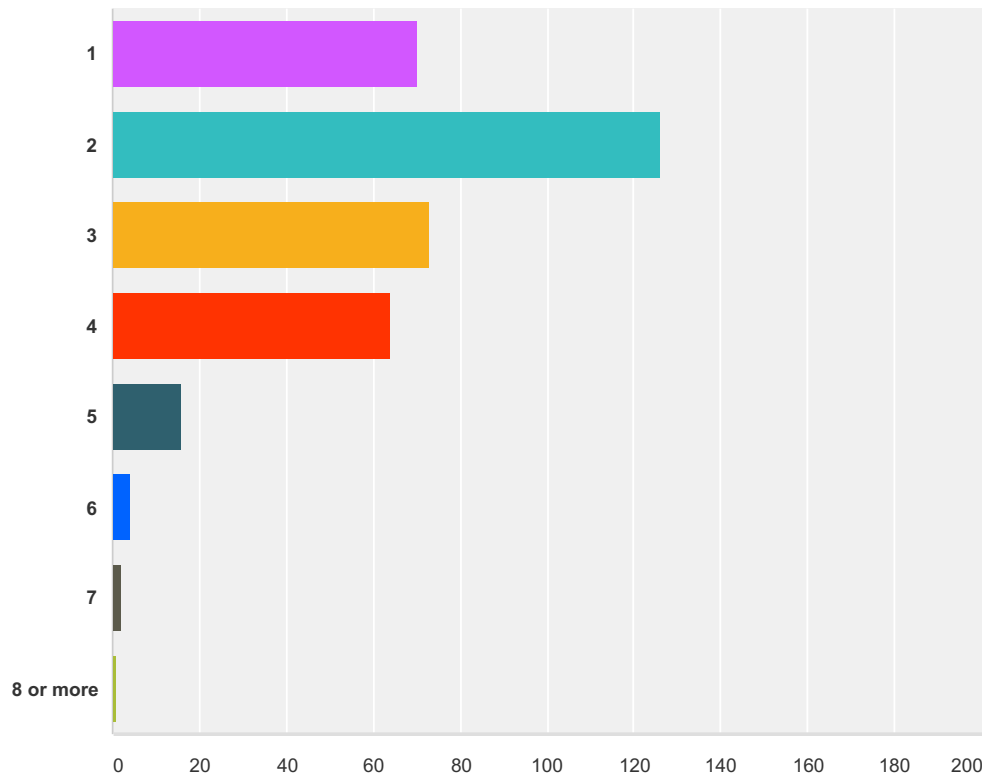
